Policies and Procedures

Attendance Policy:

Method of Evaluation

Grading for assignments and exams will be on a scale of 0% to 100%. A Pass or Fail grade will be assigned to all students. A Pass grade will have to be equal or more than a 70% of the score. Final grade will be computed by weighting all scores as follows:
